3. Focus of GCCS 2015, The Hague

- To enhance Free, open and secure cyberspace
 - Focus area
 - Economic growth and social development
 - Internet Governance
 - Multistakeholder approach
 - Cyber Security
 - Cyber crime
 - International peace and security
 - Freedom and privacy
 - Capacity building
 - Main Output
 - Global Forum On Cyber Expertise (GFCE): Dutch Minister of Foreign Affairs and Minister of Security & Justice, with 42 governments, IOs and companies, launched the GFCE in GCCS 2015.

4. Emphasis on Cyber warfare

- Along with Cybercrime(with jurisdiction) and Cyber threat, GCCS 2015 focuses on possible Cyber warfare in its aspects and strategy.
- Sessions dealing with Cyber warfare
 - Side Event: Lunch panel on 'Cyber warfare and jus in bello'
 - FOCUS SESSION: International peace and security in cyberspace
 - Parallel Session : CSIRT Maturity

5. Civil Society Empowerment program

- With the reflection of lack of proper management for and empowerment of civil society participation in past conference (Seoul),
- The GCCS Advisory Board organized civil society empowerment program including:
 - Seven webinars (since March) on key issues
 - Training and a strategy strand on key Cyberspace issues by leading experts (two-day pre conference on 4.14-15.)
 - Fellowship for civil society participants from 35 countries: pre-event and GCCS
- The event was facilitated by Global Partners Digital with Government of the Netherlands
