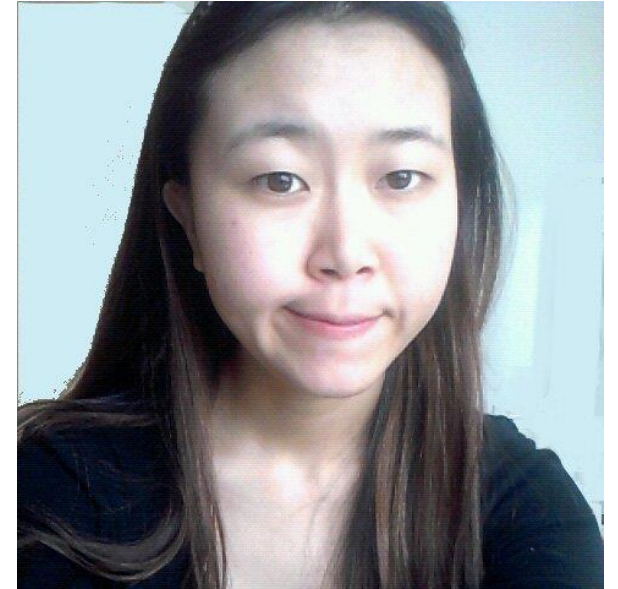

Internet governance and multistakeholder model

- The Internet is about computers/devices connecting to one another
- For this to happen, they must have ‘unique identifiers’
 - Speak the same language – ‘protocol’
 - Be able to find one another – ‘IP address’
 - Be identified in a way we can remember – ‘domain name’
- Evolution/development of ‘unique identifiers’
 - IETF, RIRs, ICANN
 - Multistakeholder model

Internet Governance Defined...

- The development and application by governments, the private sector and civil society, in their respective roles, of shared principles, norms, rules, decision-making procedures, and programmes that shape the evolution and use of the Internet (2005 – UN sponsored World Summit on the Information Society)
- How do we understand “governance” typically? What comes to mind if you apply the above definition?

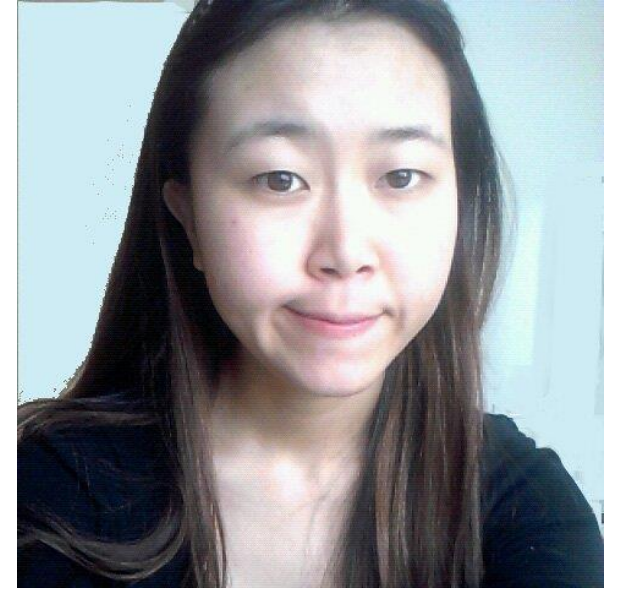
